How to find them in the ICC class schedule...

1. In the **complete schedule**, look for the **Type** column for **www**, **hybridwww**, **television**, **night owl** or **linked**.

Complete Fall Schedule Classes are listed first in their entirety and then broken out into the following categories: Downtown Peoria Campus, North Campus, ICC South, Ministers, 12WK Classes, Closed-Circuit TV, 1st 8-Weeks, 2nd 8-Weeks, Correspondence, Television, Web, Hybrid, Linked, Weekend College, Off Campus & Nonresid Classes

3. Also be sure to pay attention to the **Prerequisites/Notes** listed in the far right column of the schedule!

Type of Class	Who should take this class?	Facts about this Class
Web Classes (www) are delivered online instead of in a classroom.	A student who likes to read, write and use a computer and the Internet. A student who is self-directed and motivated to do work on his or her own.	Web classes are not easier nor do they take less time; they require as much if not more time than a traditional class. Web classes have deadlines and due dates. Web classes require access to a reliable computer and a stable connection to the Internet.
Hybrid Classes (hybridwww) are delivered through a combination of in-class instruction and the Internet. Classroom time is reduced but not eliminated.	A student who wants to blend interacting with the instructor and classmates in class with required online coursework.	A hybrid class requires as much work as a traditional class but has an active and required online component. Because of the reduced time, hybrid classes require students to prepare for classes in advance so the time in class can be used for meaningful discussion and activities. Hybrid classes require access to a reliable computer and a stable connection to the Internet.
Television Classes (television) are delivered on cable television or viewed from video tape or DVD checked out from a library. Campus visits may be required.	A student who is self-directed and motivated to do work without interacting face-to-face with the instructor and other students in a classroom setting.	Work on your own during the semester and take exams at times designated by or arranged with the instructor. Watch class programs on Cable Channel 17 (Comcast) or recordings in a library or your home. Television classes may require access to a reliable computer and a stable connection to the Internet.
Night Owl Classes (night owl) generally begin at 9 PM or later and may run as late as 3 AM.	A student who feels night/late night is the best time for learning!	Night Owl Classes are scheduled in locations convenient for students attending classes in the late evenings.
Linked Classes (linked) are different classes with the same students.	A student interested in learning a skill in one class and putting it to use in another.	Research shows students in linked classes are more likely to stay enrolled in the classes and stay in school.

What Makes a *Successful* Student in Online and Hybrid Classes?

A successful student in online and hybrid classes should:

1. **Know that high quality learning can take place without regularly going to a traditional classroom.**
2. **Be open-minded about sharing life, work, and educational experiences as part of the active online learning process.**
3. **Be interested in reading and able to communicate through writing.**
4. **Be self-motivated and self-disciplined to stay on task, completing assignments and projects by the deadlines.**
5. **Be willing to "speak up" if problems arise, using email or phone to contact the instructor or other support services for help.**
6. **Be willing and able to commit the required time per week for the class; one hour per each credit earned and two hours of "homework" or generally 9 or more hours per week for a 3 credit hour class.**
7. **Accept critical thinking and decision making as part of the learning process.**
8. **Have ready access to a reliable computer and Internet access and a 'Plan B' if the computer and/or Internet access fails.**

An online student is expected to:

- **Be able to use the required computer and Internet technology properly**
- **Participate in the online classroom 5-7 days a week or as required by the instructor**
- **Be able to work with others in discussion and completing projects**
- **Be able to complete assignments on time**
- **Be able to communicate in writing and learn through reading**
